Purpose: To promote youth environmental literacy, to encourage outdoor play, to serve as a positive adult role model.

Major Responsibilities: As an Environmental Educator, you would assist Arlington Public Schools Extended Day staff to conduct environmental education programming for a group of elementary school students, oversee skill and goal development, facilitate growth of participants, serve as liaison between Extended Day staff and 4-H Office. Volunteers work in pairs or teams at a site, so you would not be alone. If this is something new to you, don't worry, we provide training and resources for all our volunteers!

Time Commitment: 1/2 hours/week, for 6 weeks. Sessions are typically held on weekdays from 4-5pm.

Qualifications: Willingness to work with youth in a positive way, willingness to accept new and different views, work cooperatively with other volunteers, youth, and staff. Experience in environmental education desired but not required. Volunteers will be required to undergo a background screening. Training is provided.

Benefits: You'll enjoy the pleasure of working with youth to develop their potential, the satisfaction of making a difference in the community, and the fun of playing outside!

Work Location: Sessions are held at Randolph Elementary, Hoffman Boston Elementary, and Ashlawn Elementary.
